Programs & Activities

Ongoing Programs

EVE continued to develop its programs with extensive use of the internet to organize volunteer activities with partners on infectious diseases, species-at-risk, climate change and peace. We continued to work in Madagascar and Great Lakes Africa, particularly Zambia, Malawi, Uganda, Congo DRC, Kenya, Tanzania, Mozambigue, South Africa and in Canada's First Nations. Due to limited resources, we completed our charitable objects during the year primarily by the use of volunteers. We continued developing Sustainable Energy and Crowdsourcing Programs and a Youth Exchange between Indigenous Communities in Canada, Urban Canada and Africa, with a focus on species-at-risk, cultures-at-risk and infectious diseases. The interconnections between climate change and threats of natural disasters, war and infectious outbreaks have been an increasing emphasis in cross-cultural exchanges similar program to the exchanges EVE organized in 1990s. The power stats and mobile aerostats developed last year has created a platform to provide LTE and surveillance to create peace corridors in areas prone to conflict and disaster. This platform is being used to engage local communities in addressing threats of war, poaching and disasters. Internet services are being developed to cover remote areas and use the surveillance technology to identify threats in war zones disaster areas and areas where people are poaching or burning down forests. There is continued emphasis on training youth to prepare for the Internet of Things (IoT) and its applications to peace and stability.

Programs & Activities

New Programs

EVE expanded its use of the internet and the Internet of Things (IoT) to organize volunteer activities with partners on infectious diseases, species-at-risk, climate change and peace. We continued to work throughout Eastern and Southern Africa in Madagascar, Zambia, Malawi, Uganda, Congo DRC, Kenya, Tanzania, Mozambique, South Africa and in Canada's First Nations. Due to limited resources, we completed our charitable objects during the year primarily by the use of volunteers. We continued developing Sustainable Energy and Crowdsourcing Programs and a Youth Exchange between Indigenous Communities in Canada, Urban Canada and Africa, with a focus on species-at-risk, cultures-at-risk and infectious diseases. We began collaborating with anti-poaching efforts in Zambia, Malawi and Mozambique using the power stat platform to create peace corridors in areas in and around national parks and trans frontier conservation areas. This platform is being used to engage local communities in addressing threats of war, poaching, pandemics and disasters. Internet services are being developed to cover remote areas and use the surveillance technology to identify threats in war zones disaster areas and areas where people are poaching or burning down forests. There is increased on training youth to prepare for the IoT and its applications to peace and freedom. EVE began designing virtual internships with universities in Canada and Africa, with a mission to increase cross-cultural exchanges for youth between Canada and Africa.


